NUNAVUT ARCTIC COLLEGE REGULATIONS

1. In these regulations,

"business of the Board" includes any meeting of the Board or the executive committee of the Board and any assignment to a member of the Board as approved by the Board or the executive committee. (*affaires du Conseil*)

2. The following regions are established:

- (a) the Keewatin Region;
- (b) the Kitikmeot Region;
- (c) the Baffin Region.

3. The communities represented by each region are set out in the Schedule.

4. (1) A member of the Board shall be paid \$200 for each day, including travel days, that the member attends to the business of the Board.

(2) Where a member attends to the business of the Board for 1/2 day or less, the amount paid shall be 1/2 of the daily rate. S.Nu. 2011,c.27,s.21(3).

5. The chairperson of the Board shall be paid \$75 for each day, in addition to the amount paid to him or her as a member, including travel days, that the chairperson attends to the business of the Board. S.Nu. 2011,c.27,s.21(3).

6. A member of the Board shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred when attending to the business of the Board, at the rate set out as of the date of these regulations for persons employed in the public service of the Northwest Territories. S.Nu. 2011,c.27,s.21(3).

7. (1) The Board shall forward the name of each proposed member of the Science Advisory Council to the Minister, and if the Minister consents, the Board may make the appointment.

(2) The Science Advisory Council shall consist of not less than five and not more than 20 members.

(3) A member may be appointed to the Science Advisory Council for a term not exceeding three years, but a member may be removed before the expiry of his or her term where, in the opinion of the Board, the removal of the member would be in the best interests of the Council.

(4) The Board shall appoint members to the Science Advisory Council so as to ensure that the Science Advisory Council collectively holds the following qualifications:

- (a) knowledge of scientific research methods;

- (b) experience in conducting scientific research in general;
- (c) experience in conducting scientific research in Nunavut;
- (d) understanding of the issues facing scientific researchers in Nunavut;
- (e) expertise in multiple fields of scientific endeavour;
- (f) familiarity with other academic institutions;
- (g) knowledge of Inuit societal values;
- (h) knowledge of the guiding principles and concepts of Inuit Qaujimajatuqangit, as defined in the *Wildlife Act*;
- (i) understanding of regional issues in Nunavut.

(5) The members of the Science Advisory Council shall elect a chairperson and a vice-chairperson from among themselves. R-006-2009,s.4; S.Nu. 2011,c.27,s.21(3).
