DRUG SCHEDULES REGULATIONS, amendment

The Minister, under section 27 and subsection 28(1) of the *Pharmacy Act*, and every enabling power, makes the annexed amendments to the *Drug Schedules Regulations*.

- 1. These regulations amend the *Drug Schedules Regulations*.
- 2. Sections 1 and 2 are repealed and replaced by the following:
- 1. (1) In these regulations,

"authorized health care professional" means any of the following acting in their professional capacity:

- (a) a medical practitioner,
- (b) a pharmaceutical chemist,
- (c) a veterinary surgeon,
- (d) a dentist,
- (e) a nurse registered under the Nursing Professions Act,
- (f) a registered midwife; (professionnel de la santé habilité)

"National Drug Schedules" means the National Drug Schedules established by the National Association of Pharmacy Regulatory Authorities; (annexes nationales de médicaments)

"prescription" means a prescription made in writing, verbally, by facsimile or by electronic means that are secure and encrypted by a person authorized by law in Nunavut, a province or other territory to make the prescription; (ordonnance)

"Schedule I" means Schedule I of the National Drug Schedules; (annexe I)

"Schedule II" means Schedule II of the National Drug Schedules as modified for Nunavut under section 2; (annexe II)

"Schedule III" means Schedule III of the National Drug Schedules. (annexe III)

- (2) For the purposes of the Act and these regulations, a person is deemed to be under the supervision of a pharmaceutical chemist if
 - (a) the pharmaceutical chemist has authorized the supervision; and

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(b) the pharmaceutical chemist is available for assistance and consultation in person, by telephone or by secure and encrypted electronic means that allow for simultaneous voice communication.

- 2. (1) Subject to this section, the National Drug Schedules are adopted as amended from time to time under section 28 of the Act.
- (2) Schedule II of the National Drug Schedules adopted under subsection (1) is modified for Nunavut by removing the following substances:
 - (a) naloxone hydrochloride nasal spray, when indicated for emergency use for opioid overdose; and
 - (b) naloxone hydrochloride injection, when indicated for emergency use for opioid overdose.
- 2. The following provisions are amended by replacing "direct personal supervision" with "supervision" wherever it appears:
 - (a) section 4;
 - (b) paragraph 5(c).
- 3. The following provisions are amended by adding "or a person under the supervision of a pharmaceutical chemist" after "pharmaceutical chemist" wherever it appears:
 - (a) the portion of section 5 preceding paragraph (a);
 - (b) paragraph 5(b);
 - (c) the portion of section 6 preceding paragraph (a);
 - (d) section 9.
- 4. Paragraph 6(b) is repealed and replaced by the following:
 - (b) not open to the public when a pharmaceutical chemist is not present.
- 5. Section 7 is repealed and replaced by the following:
- 7. (1) A pharmaceutical chemist may supply a substance
 - (a) included in Schedule I, II or III to a person named in a prescription for the substance or their agent;
 - (b) included in Schedule I, II or III to an authorized health care professional with a prescription for the substance; or
 - (c) included in Schedule I to an authorized health care professional without a prescription for the substance.
 - (2) A person under the supervision of a pharmaceutical chemist may supply a substance
 - (a) included in Schedule I, II or III to
 - (i) a person named in a prescription for the substance or their agent if
 - (A) a pharmaceutical chemist is present and available for consultation with the person named in the prescription for the substance or their agent, and
 - (B) a pharmaceutical chemist has verified the preparation, packaging and labelling of the substance in person or by secure and encrypted videoconference, or

- (ii) an authorized health care professional with a prescription for the substance if
 - (A) a pharmaceutical chemist is available for consultation with the authorized health care professional in person, by telephone or by secure and encrypted electronic means that allow for simultaneous voice communication, and
 - (B) a pharmaceutical chemist has verified the preparation, packaging and labelling of the substance in person or by secure and encrypted videoconference; or
- (b) included in Schedule I to an authorized health care professional without a prescription for the substance if
 - (i) a pharmaceutical chemist is available for consultation with the authorized health care professional in person, by telephone or by secure and encrypted electronic means that allow for simultaneous voice communication, and
 - (ii) if the substance has been repackaged, a pharmaceutical chemist has verified the preparation, packaging and labelling of the substance in person or by secure and encrypted videoconference.
- 6. Section 8 is repealed.
- 7. Section 9 is amended
 - (a) in the English version, by replacing "oral prescription" with "verbal prescription";
 - (b) by repealing and replacing subparagraphs (a)(i) and (ii) with the following:
 - (i) the person providing the verbal prescription is authorized by law in Nunavut, a province or other territory to prescribe the substance, and
 - (ii) the person to whom the substance is delivered is
 - (A) the person named in the prescription or their agent, or
 - (B) an authorized health care professional; and
- 8. Sections 10 to 11 are repealed and replaced by the following:
- 10. A substance included in Schedule II may be supplied to
 - (a) an authorized health care professional without a prescription

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- (i) by a pharmaceutical chemist, or
- (ii) by a person under the supervision of a pharmaceutical chemist, if a pharmaceutical chemist is available for consultation with the authorized health care professional in person, by telephone or by secure and encrypted electronic means that allow for simultaneous voice communication; or
- (b) any other person without a prescription
 - (i) by a pharmaceutical chemist, or

- (ii) by a person under the supervision of a pharmaceutical chemist if
 - (A) the pharmaceutical chemist is present and available for consultation with the person, and
 - (B) the supply of the substance has been authorized by the pharmaceutical chemist.
- 11. A substance included in Schedule III may be supplied to
 - (a) an authorized health care professional without a prescription
 - (i) if a pharmaceutical chemist or a person under the supervision of a pharmaceutical chemist is present, and
 - (ii) if a pharmaceutical chemist is available for consultation with the authorized health care professional in person, by telephone or by secure and encrypted electronic means that allow for simultaneous voice communication; and
 - (b) any other person without a prescription if a pharmaceutical chemist is present and available for consultation.

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
