## BEER AND WINE STORE REGULATIONS

1. In these regulations,

“Beer and Wine Store” means a liquor store established by the Minister in a municipality listed in the Schedule for the purpose of selling wine and low alcohol content liquor which may be carried away by retail customers; (*magasin de bière et de vin*)

"low alcohol content liquor" means

- (a) beer, and
- (b) any other liquor with no more than 8% alcohol by volume;  
(*boisson alcoolisée à faible teneur en alcool*)

"wine" includes fortified wine with no more than 20% alcohol by volume. (*vin*)

2. Each Beer and Wine Store is designated as a liquor store from which purchasers may personally carry away liquor.

3. A Beer and Wine Store may only be open between the hours of noon and 7 p.m., any day except holidays.

4. (1) Any adult may apply to the Minister for a customer account for the purpose of purchasing liquor at Beer and Wine Stores by providing his or her address and presenting photographic identification satisfactory to the Minister.

(2) The Minister shall issue and maintain a customer account for any adult who has made an application under subsection (1).

5. (1) Any person purchasing liquor at a Beer and Wine Store must have a customer account and present photographic identification satisfactory to the vendor.

(2) The vendor shall record each purchase made at a Beer and Wine Store in the appropriate customer account.

6. A person may purchase up to any one of the following amounts of wine and low alcohol content liquor at each Beer and Wine Store during each calendar day:

- (a) twelve litres of low alcohol content liquor;
- (b) nine litres of low alcohol content liquor and 0.75 litres of wine;
- (c) six litres of low alcohol content liquor and 1.5 litres of wine;
- (d) three litres of low alcohol content liquor and 2.25 litres of wine;
- (e) three litres of wine.

7. (1) No person shall purchase liquor at a Beer and Wine Store
    - (a) without a customer account;
    - (b) without photographic identification satisfactory to the vendor; or
    - (c) in excess of the amounts described in section 6.
  
  - (2) No vendor shall sell liquor at a Beer and Wine Store to any person
    - (a) who does not have a customer account;
    - (b) who does not present photographic identification satisfactory to the vendor;  
or
    - (c) whose customer account indicates that the person has, during the current calendar day, already purchased the amounts described in section 6.
  
  - (3) For greater certainty, no person shall purchase and no vendor shall sell any liquor other than wine and low alcohol content liquor at a Beer and Wine Store. R-026-2018,s.3.
8. **The *Iqaluit Beer and Wine Store Regulations* are repealed.**
