REMUNERATION AND ALLOWANCES REGULATIONS

1. An honorarium of \$350 each year is payable to a justice of the peace who is designated as active by the senior judge.
2. Where a justice of the peace is authorized by the senior judge to act at a presiding level, a fee of \$45 each hour, to a maximum of \$270 each day, is payable to the justice of the peace for exercising the powers and performing the duties referred to in section 14 or 15 of the Act.
3. The following fees are payable to a justice of the peace who is designated under section 48 of the *Family Abuse Intervention Act*:
 - (a) where the justice of the peace hears and determines applications for emergency protection or community intervention orders, \$60 each hour;
 - (b) where the justice of the peace serves as a primary on-call justice of the peace, \$100 each week;
 - (c) where the justice of the peace serves as a secondary on-call justice of the peace, \$50 each week.
4. An allowance of \$100 each day is payable to a justice of the peace attending a training seminar approved by the senior judge.
5. If a member of the public service exercises the powers and carries out the duties of a justice of the peace
 - (a) the fee referred to in sections 2 and 3 is payable only to the extent that the person is not otherwise remunerated for exercising those powers and carrying out those duties; and
 - (b) the allowance referred to in section 4 is payable only to the extent that the person is not granted paid leave to attend the training.

6. The *Remuneration and Allowances Regulations*, registered under the *Statutory Instruments Act* (Northwest Territories) as regulation numbered R-056-98, as duplicated for Nunavut by section 29 of the *Nunavut Act* (Canada), are repealed.
